### **Wildlife and Lands Project Summer Youth Worker Temporary Full-time (12-Week Term)**

St'át'imc Government Services (SGS) is seeking a Wildlife and Lands Project Summer Student to provide technical assistance with day-to-day activities, including land use, wildlife, wildfire, environmental, and mitigation plans for species at risk, and other natural resource concerns for the Environment Department, both in the office and in the field. Reports directly to the SGS Environment Manager.

#### **Duties and Responsibilities:**

- » Performs all duties in accordance with the St'át'imc Government Services policies, standards, and procedures, and as directed by the SGS Environment Manager.
- » Maintains confidentiality on all matters relating to the affairs of St'át'imc Government Services.
- » Provides technical assistance with the wildlife management programs, including the McKay Creek Wildfire Rehabilitation Planning and Monitoring, Wildlife Health Program, Fraser River Bighorn Sheep Monitoring, Bridge-Seton Watershed Strategic Plan, and other Territory-wide conservation strategies.
- » Assists the SGS Environment Manager and Wildlife Technician with the collection and analysis of biological and Traditional Knowledge of plants, species at risk, and habitats.
- » Assists with providing recommendations effectively on natural resource issues as they arise, both orally and in writing.
- » Participates in technical meetings as required and job shadowing opportunities with the Provincial Wildfire Officer, Lillooet Tribal Council's Emergency Planning Coordinator, and the SGS Environment Technicians.
- » Focuses on team project delivery on multiple projects and ensure quality standards on deliverables under the direction from the SGS Environment Manager and Wildlife Technician.
- » Works in cooperation and as a team member of the SGS Environment Program, other staff of St'át'imc Government Services, and the St'át'imc Communities.

#### **Experience and Personal Qualifications:**

- » Must be between 15 and 30 years of age (inclusive) at the start of employment. Requirement of funding source.
- » Already attending or have plans to attend a post-secondary program (technical diploma or bachelors) focusing on Environment, Risk Assessment, Natural Resource Management, or other related discipline.
- » Entry level experience with following protocols, processing biological samples and other field essentials, including sampling equipment, and the documentation and reporting of findings.
- » Familiarity and entry level experience within St'át'imc Territory, its diverse ecology, and traditional and current use of wildlife, forestry, plants, and other natural resources.
- » Problem-solving skills and able to identify key issues and overcome obstacles.
- » Effective oral and written communication skills.
- » Experience working with First Nations organizations, agencies, or communities an asset.
- » Basic computer skills with MS (Word, PowerPoint, Outlook, Excel).
- » Flexible and adaptability.
- » Good work ethics and do work with integrity.



**Knowledge:**

- » Understanding of St'át'imc Communities, Culture, and Traditional Territory.
- » Knowledge of ecology, species identification, habitat requirements and conservation threats within the Territory.

**Conditions of Employment:**

- » Valid driver's license preferred.
- » Includes both office and outdoor fieldwork, including hiking of rough terrain and in variable weather conditions.
- » Ability to travel as required.
- » Ability to work overtime and weekends as required.
- » Hourly rate of \$22/hr and 35-hour work week
- » Potential start date June 3, 2024

Preference will be given to qualified applicants of St'át'imc or First Nations ancestry.
